PUBLIC NOTICE

CEREDIGION COUNTY COUNCIL TOWN & POLICE CLAUSES ACT 1847 (SECTION 21) Lampeter Carnival 2025

NOTICE is hereby given that the Ceredigion County Council has made the following Order under Section 21 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 for the Prevention of Obstruction etc.

WHEREAS on Saturday 9th August 2025, between the hours of 12:30 and 13:20 due to the above Lampeter Carnival taking place, that a section of the roads known as Peterwell Terrace (from Ysgol Bro Pedr entrance), Hafan Deg Road, A475 Temple Terrace, A475 High Street, A482 Harford Square, Drovers Road, New Street, A482 Bridge Street, A482 College Street, A482 North Road (to Lampeter Rugby Club entrance) Lampeter in the county of Ceredigion, will be thronged and liable to be obstructed. Ceredigion County Council pursuant to the powers conferred by Section 21 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 DO HEREBY ORDER AND DIRECT that for the purpose of preventing obstruction in the said road on the said day the following regulations shall be observed:-

- 1. Subject to those provisions contained in articles 3 and 4, that the section of the roads known as Peterwell Terrace (from Ysgol Bro Pedr entrance), Hafan Deg Road, A475 Temple Terrace, A475 High Street, A482 Harford Square, Drovers Road, New Street, A482 Bridge Street, A482 College Street, A482 North Road (to Lampeter Rugby Club entrance) Lampeter, in the county of Ceredigion shall be closed to all vehicular traffic including pedal cycles between 12:30 hours and 13:20 hours on Saturday, 9th of August 2025.
- 2. There is no alternative route as each section of road will be closed for no more than 15 minuets and re-opened as the parade progresses.

 Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.
- 3. The provisions of article 1 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the restrictions referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs or designated stewards.
- 4. Nothing in article 1 of this order shall apply to any vehicle being used by the emergency services, vehicles being used in connection with the events giving rise to this order, or anything done with the permission or under the direction of a police officer.

The penalty for infringement of the said Regulations is a fine not exceeding One Thousand Pounds.
