PUBLIC NOTICE CEREDIGION COUNTY COUNCIL TOWN & POLICE CLAUSES ACT 1847 (SECTION 21)

BORTH CARNIVAL 2025

NOTICE is hereby given that the Ceredigion County Council has made the following Order under Section 21 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 for the Prevention of Obstruction etc.

WHEREAS during certain hours on Friday 1st August 2025, between 13:30 hours and 15:30 hours due to Borth Carnival celebrations taking place, that a section of the road known as the B4353 High Street, Borth in the county of Ceredigion, will be thronged and liable to be obstructed.

Ceredigion County Council pursuant to the powers conferred by Section 21 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847 DO HEREBY ORDER AND DIRECT that for the purpose of preventing obstruction in the said roads on the said day the following regulations shall be observed:-

- .1. Subject to those provisions contained in articles 2 and 3, that the section of road known as the B4353 High Street, Borth in the county of Ceredigion shall be closed to all vehicular traffic including pedal cycles between 13.30 hours and 15:30 hours on Friday 1st August 2025.
- 2. The provisions of article 1 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the restrictions referred to therein are indicated by traffic signs and designated stewards.
- .3. Nothing in article 1 of this order shall apply to any vehicle being used by the emergency services, vehicles being used in connection with the events giving rise to this order, or anything done with the permission or under the direction of a police officer in uniform.
- 4. The alternative route for southbound traffic from a point north of the closure is to travel along the B4353 to its junction with the A487T at Tre'r-ddôl. Turn right into the A487T and travel to its junction with the B4353 at Rhydypennau. Turn right into the B4353 and travel to a point south of the closure. Vice versa for northbound traffic. Pedestrian access will be maintained at all times.

The penalty for infringement of the said Regulations is a fine not exceeding One Thousand Pounds.
